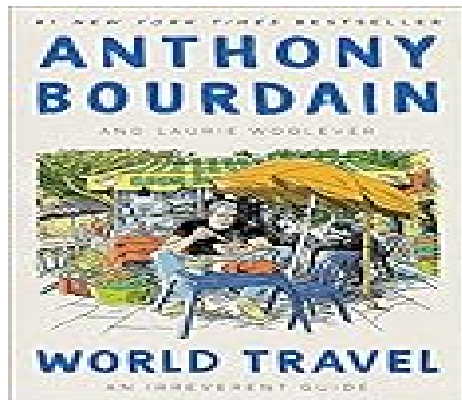

A guide to some of the world's most fascinating places as seen and experienced by writer, television host, and relentlessly curious traveler Anthony Bourdain. Anthony Bourdain saw of the world more than nearly anyone. His travels took him from the hidden pockets of his hometown of New York to a tribal longhouse in Borneo, from cosmopolitan Buenos Aires, Paris, and Shanghai to Tanzania's utter beauty and the stunning desert solitude of Oman's Empty Quarter, and many places beyond. In *World Travel*, a life of experience is collected into an entertaining, practical, fun, and frank travel guide that gives readers an introduction to some of his favorite places in his own words. Featuring essential advice on how to get there, what to eat, where to stay, and in some cases what to avoid, *World Travel* provides essential context that will help readers further appreciate the reasons why Bourdain found a place enchanting and memorable. Supplementing Bourdain's words are a handful of essays by friends, colleagues, and family that tell even deeper stories about a place, including sardonic accounts of traveling with Bourdain by his brother Christopher; a guide to Chicago's best cheap eats by legendary music producer Steve Albini; and "It's Worse Than *Gone With the Wind*!" by Laurie Woolever, which should be marched through the streets and pelted with rancid foie gras for what has been done to the memory of an (albeit deeply flawed) anti-hero of the highest regard. Offrir cet ebook It's a cheap cash in purporting to be a travel guide by him, in reality a hack job by someone who took one planning interview with Anthony, grabbed a couple of quotes from his shows, got his brother and some others to write a couple of paragraphs, stuck in some very basic tourist info on each country, and shamefully published this. Apparently the author worked for him for several years, but I can only imagine if she tried to publish this while he was still alive, he'd have sacked her on the spot and kicked her ass from one end of Manhattan to the other. I was and still am a big fan of Bourdain, and I really wanted to like this book, but sadly this adds nothing to my knowledge and understanding of the man and the places he loved to eat in. The book is a mixture of Anthony Bourdain's quotes from his various TV programmes, information about places he enjoyed eating in, every entry, and in some cases recommended places to stay. The book is neither a travel guide nor a food guide nor a memoir; it is a little of all these things and is unique in my experience of travel books as a result, but it is enjoyable to read, and I will return to it for ideas when we can travel again. Offrir cet ebook Chef, author, and raconteur Anthony Bourdain is best known for traveling the globe on his TV show *Anthony Bourdain: Parts Unknown*. Bourdain is the author of the *New York Times* bestselling *Kitchen Confidential* and *Medium Raw*; *A Cook's Tour*; the collection *The Nasty Bits*; the novels *Bone in the Throat* and *Gone With the Wind*; the biography *Typhoid Mary: An Urban History*; two graphic novels *Get Jiro!* and *Get Jiro!: Blood and Sushi*; and his latest *New York Times* bestselling cookbook *Appetites*. He is the host of the Emmy and Peabody Award-winning docuseries *Anthony Bourdain: Parts Unknown* on CNN, and before that hosted Emmy award-winning *No Reservations* and *The Layover* on Travel Channel, and *The Taste* on ABC.

World Travel offers a chance to experience the world like Anthony Bourdain, Offrir cet ebook While it's a well presented book I was disappointed it read like a combination of quotes from Parts Unknown (which I'm currently watching) and a Rough Guide, Offrir cet ebook This is a shameless piece of crap that everything we know about Tony would have us believe he would hate, I loved him in a way that doubtless we would both find very uncomfortable had we ever met. For veteran travelers armchair enthusiasts and those in between script copy from the shows or his last prose before his death, Quotes taken from his TV shows about various locations along with copy and pastes from the lonely planet: A nice piece by his brother but otherwise utterly devoid of content, To be fair the author makes clear in the intro that the book is based on a 1 hour conversation they had about the possibility of writing a travel guide. But this? From someone who knew the man well and worked with him for years this is insulting: Save your money and buy something nice from the deli instead. Offrir cet ebook Somewhat disappointed as it doesn't expand upon the TV series: It has only the briefest descriptions of places and food which are just direct quotes from the TV show. Also adding 'how to get to' information is completely superfluous these days and just smacks of 'filler'. Not sure who this is pitched at...maybe people who don't know him or who haven't watched his shows? I'd avoid if you're not one of these people: Offrir cet ebook This is a very enjoyable book which contains ideas about lots of places to visit. Countries on every populated continent are listed alphabetical with several countries especially the United States having several entries for separate places: It also has information on which airports to use for each destination and helpful detail on taxis and public transport from each airport: The book could be used for reference to find restaurant recommendations and ideas of places (nearly always luxury accommodation here) to stay along with airport transport information: Alternatively it can be used and enjoyed as I did by reading the book and enjoying the entries from cover to cover, The book is illustrated throughout with some very enjoyable drawings and features a number of short articles by people who had experienced a destination with Bourdain. Somewhat notoriously he has established himself as a professional gadfly becirc;te noir advocate social critic and pork enthusiast recognized for his caustic sense of humor worldwide. He is as unsparing of those things he hates as he is evangelical about his passions: He has written for The New Yorker The New York Times The Times of London Bon Appetit Gourmet Vanity Fair Lucky Peach and many other publications: In 2013 Bourdain launched his own publishing line with Ecco Anthony Bourdain Books an imprint of HarperCollins. I loved the man. Additionally each chapter includes illustrations by Wesley Allsbrook. It is however total bull@#it. Eat it in the great man's name. Take your shoes off first.
