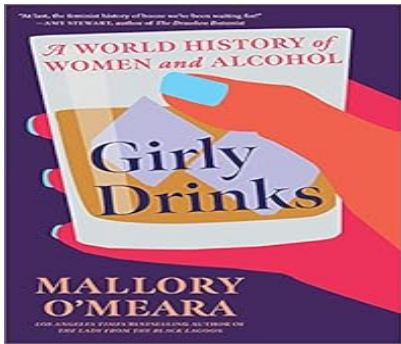


Girly Drinks: A World History of Women and Alcohol By birchovervillage.co.uk
